### **NAPLAN** Online

Our Year 3 and Year 5 students will be completing <u>NAPLAN online</u> this year as part of the move towards all schools nationally being involved over a two-to-three year period. Our students will not be disadvantaged with class teachers now including the skills required into their programmes. It is important to note that Year 3 students will this year complete just the Writing with pencil and paper—all other tests will be done online. NAPLAN tests will be completed in the period 15 to 22 May. <u>FAQ here</u>.

#### Sunsmart

With the support of the P&C the school is moving towards implementing a Sunsmart policy. We have always had a policy of *no hat, no play in the sun,* and this is an integral part of a Sunsmart policy. The only supported hats are of the bucket style in royal blue. Students can still wear wide-brimmed hats and legionnaire style caps provided that they are in the school colour of royal blue. Bucket hats are available from our uniform supplier, Uniform Concepts in Joondalup, or through the school office.



The application of sunscreen is an important part of the Sunsmart policy and it encourages all parents/carers to apply this to their children prior to them coming to school. The P&C have provided a large bottle of sunscreen for every classroom so that students may reapply some prior to going out to lunch.
